

SENATOR GOODRICH: Page 2, Section 8, it's line 21 and 22.

CLERK: I just need section, Section 8, Senator?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Eight.

CLERK: Department of Education, right?

SENATOR GOODRICH: But there are two parts in there, School for the Deaf \$67,000, and School for the Visually Handicapped \$32,000. I'm only talking about the School for the Visually Handicapped portion, on line 22 of the second page.

CLERK: You are talking page 2, lines 19 through the end of the page, and then pages...line 1 on page 3, right?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes.

CLERK: Right, thank you.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Well, Madam President, it would appear to me that if we are going to separate this particular part, like we have the rest of this amendment, we should just separate out Section 8. I would suggest that we do so because to separate out only the School for the Visually Handicapped, when we are also talking about the School for the Deaf in that particular amendment, it seems to me we should deal with the two...that section in total. Is that what you are doing, Mr. Clerk? Are you separating all of Section 8 out? Okay, I apologize. I thought you were only taking one part of it.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: I think we have that clear now. So...so we'll vote on a package now, less that Section. Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Madam Chairman and members of the Legislature, I sincerely appreciate Senator Goodrich's motion and his move, but I feel guilty in having him do it. It is tough to talk against it, but I really don't think we should do it. We made our decision and it was no fault of anybody but mine. I don't want to rectify my faults in doing it this way. I think we'd better leave it as it is
