SENATOR MOREHEAD: Senator Goodrich, I think probably procedurally it would be up to you to officially withdraw.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Okay, against my better judgement I will withdraw in deference to Senator Carsten's wishes.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Thank you, Senator Goodrich. We are now back on the original package as presented by Senator Warner. I have no other lights on, so I will recognize Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: I would just move it, Madam President.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Thank you, Senator Warner. The motion before us is the adoption of the package of amendments as proposed to 722, presented by Senator Warner.

CLERK: Senator Morehead voting yes.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the Appropriations Committee amendments to the bill, Madam President.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: The next motion that we have before us is a part that has been pulled out of the amendments, Section 39.

CLERK: 39, Senator, is the Victim-Witness Center. Page 11, right. (See Warner second amendment found on page 2385 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Page 11, Section 39, the Chair recognizes Senator Pirsch. Chair withdraws and recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move adoption of the amendment which would strike \$84,792. This particular item was one that was on one of the early lists that the committee reviewed prior to public hearings. After the public hearings the funds were reinstated. Part of our
