SENATOR MOREHEAD: Senator Beutler. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Madam Chairperson, since ten people are now missing, and difficult issues are impossible to debate, I move to adjourn.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Machine vote, or is that debatable? We are in the middle of a vote.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: We may have a slight problem. The question before us is since we've just had a motion to adjourn, and it was defeated, our rules say that another motion to adjourn is not in order, unless we've had intervening business. And we have not enacted intervening business. So I move...Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Madam Chairperson, I move to reconsider the motion to adjourn.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: How did you vote, Senator Beutler? Since Senator Beutler voted no, and the motion lost, it is appropriate for Senator Beutler to make a motion for reconsideration of adjournment. The motion before us is adjournment. There has been a machine vote requested. Correction of the Chair. The motion before us is reconsideration of the motion to adjourn. And a machine vote has been requested. We are now machine voting on whether we should reconsider the motion to adjourn. It is debatable.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, that is the question I was going to ask. Quite early this morning our Speaker announced, and I believe most of us were here at the time, that we were going to work until five-thirty. So I urge the members that are left that we stay according to the Speaker's agenda and work until five-thirty. It is important that we get some of these things done, as our Speaker has said time and time again. I urge you not to vote to adjourn, or reconsider. After the reconsideration, am I correct that we will then have to vote to adjourn, a machine vote? That is what I will request.
