SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, is there any further discussion on the adoption of the first committee amendment? If not, the question is shall the first committee amendment be adopted? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the adoption of the first amendment?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the first committee amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The first committee amendment is adopted. How about the second committee amendment? (See second Standing Committee amendment found on page 2392 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR FIRSCH: Yes, Mr. Speaker, these are the committee amendments. They are not my amendments, but I have no objection to them. This is adding, on page 6, expanding a little bit on the owner of the seized property, and adding, "or any person having an interest in", which puts a little tighter guard on this particular section. So I would agree with it and urge you to adopt it.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any further discussion on the second committee amendment? Okay, the question is the adoption of the second committee amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the adoption of the second committee amendment. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.
