SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator, can you help me? Which one would that be? Would that be the...

SENATOR PIRSCH: That was my...

CLERK: Oh, by striking...

SENATOR PIRSCH: ...amendment to the committee amendments, by striking five and six. And if there is no objections, I'd like to take them together since they all hang together. Is that possible?

CLERK: May I make a suggestion?

SENATOR PIRSCH: Yes.

CLERK: I don't know where the Chair of the committee is at on this, but rather than...just encourage people to vote no rather than trying to amend the committee amendment, Senator, you know...

SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay.

CLERK: You are trying to strike Sections 5 and 6 of the committee amendments, I would just encourage people to vote no if that is your position.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay, all right, fine.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hoagland, are you going to talk on amendment five, first? (See fifth Standing Committee found on page 2393 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Briefly, Mr. Speaker. I believe the committee, at least a number of us, have no objection to Senator Pirsch's amendments which would strike committee amendments five and six and add some additional language. So I think at this point we would urge the body to vote no in adopting amendment number five of the committee amendments.
