

it is a compromise. Now Senator Schmit's area, 28 to 11, Vickers, 94 to 14; the big numbers are in favor; DeCamp, 293 to 6; Rogers, 54 to 12 in favor of doing away with the whole thing. This is a compromise. Lamb, 300 to 18, 300 to 18; Scofield, 212 to 20; Remmers, 15 to 1, 15 people want to do away with the whole program and one was in favor of keeping it. So this isn't doing away with the program. This is letting the people have a refund if they want it. It isn't going to destroy the program. Senator Remmers also said that the big cattle people want this program, therefore, they will not ask for a refund, according to Senator Remmers and I think he is right. So the intent of the whole bill, the intent of the whole bill is let's do it this way. They say it's only been in effect two years. Fine, let's try two years on a refund basis and see what happens. Let's quit hammering this home, a mandatory check-off, let's make it voluntary. If it destroys the program I will come back to help put it the other way, but I don't think it will. Now the cattle, what are we getting, what are the prices for cattle? We slipped, from number one, way down. The price of cattle are down. So I've used my arguments and I don't know what else I can say to you. I've got a feeling in my bones that this isn't going to pass but, Mr. President, I'm going to try. So I'm going to ask for a call of the house.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.
