CLERK: (Read record found on pages 2399-2400 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 17 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. LB 284.

CLERK: Mr. President, 284 was a bill that was introduced by Senators...by the Public Works Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 17 and was referred to the Agriculture and Environment Committee for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are Ag and Environment amendments pending. (See Standing Committee amendments found on page 1483 of the Legislative Journal.)
