

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you very much. I did understand correctly. I do understand that the reduction of the dollars means that a young woman who finds herself pregnant has many more reasons to consider the option of abortion if she does not have funding to properly take care of herself and her unborn child. I do not support this amendment. I do not support the reduction of funding that currently is on the books for the poor who need the help. All of you in this legislative body who have been strong opponents of the right of choice certainly would not want to be reducing, certainly would not want to be increasing the reasons for someone to have to seek an abortion, do you? Do you care? Are you concerned?

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on the pending amendment to 722? The motion is the adoption of the amendment. Do you want to say anything further, Senator Warner? Very well, the motion is the adoption of the amendment explained by Senator Warner and commented on by Senator Marsh. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. We are on Select File and all amendments take 25 votes in order to pass. Members, please record your vote if you wish to vote on the amendment to 722 which has held over from last week. Have you all voted? Members are asked to record your vote. The motion before the House is the adoption of the amendment of reduction on LB 722 explained by Senator Warner. Members, please vote on the...register your vote if you wish to vote. Senator Warner, what are you asking?

SENATOR WARNER: I guess I'd ask for a call of the house and call in votes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, Senator. A call of the house has been requested and the question before you now is, shall the house come under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 10 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries and the house is under call. And you may call in your vote to the Clerk.
