asking to do is to increase the charge from \$1.00 to \$2.00 in order to get a copy of a motor vehicle report which is a record of a person's driving for the past, I think they go back five years. Is that correct?

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Higgins, the adoption of this amendment in itself will not do that.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Okay.

SENATOR WARNER: Adoption of this amendment would change the appropriation bill in the event LB 83 is enacted which right now it stands indefinitely postponed.

SENATOR HIGGINS: So this amendment would leave it at \$1.00?

SENATOR WARNER: No, ma'am. This amendment permits...it's a thing that is done frequently toward the end of a session where there is pending legislation that might affect the budget so an appropriation bill is written to reflect if the passage of a certain bill occurs, then the money is appropriated one way; if the bill fails, then the money is appropriated a different way, but it does not affect the total funding in this case.

SENATOR HIGGINS: So if this bill fails, you're saying this amendment is just going to put it back to where it was.

SENATOR WARNER: The amendment accommodates if LB 83 passes, then the funding would be more cash funds, less general fund. If LB 83 does not pass, everything stays like it is and this amendment is written to accommodate whatever the Legislature as a policy matter decides on LB 83.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Okay, thank you, Senator Warner.
