People aren't too nervous with that, but when I talk about Big Red football and cheating people get awfully jumpy. I don't see reporters taking notes. I don't see anything because those who want to be the eyes and ears for the public of what this Legislature does had best not deal with certain issues and I know that. But there is going to be a record in the legislative debates if anybody is interested in reading that record. I said that to bring us back to what Senator DeCamp is proposing. You might could argue if you were in an ethical deliberative assembly...
