

this big, strapping National Guardsman who is learning how to go out here and kill people, if necessary, and I'm going to give him something to go to school on and I'm not going to help a baby be born? That is crazy from my point of view. But what I'm talking about is crazy from the majority of your point of view. So I want us to look at these items one by one. And Senator DeCamp can show us which ones ought to be in here. So if you knock me down on this amendment, and you take his amendment as is, you still, before you can adopt it, are going to have to divide the question. After you divide the question, and go ahead and adopt his amendment, each one of these things becomes a part of the bill. Then I can offer to strike each one of them, and we'll discuss it that way. So, as Senator Beutler said, you can have it any way that you want to. This is Burger King or McDonald's this afternoon, have it your way.

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm here to stay with you as long as you want to stay. I'll raise your blood pressure as high as what I'm doing will raise it, make your heart palpitate, make you change colors, whatever happens when you get very upset. How unreasonable is it to start with a clean slate and then add those things which ought to be excluded? Maybe there will be propositions other than these. That is what my amendment simply does. I hope you'll adopt it.
