PRESIDENT: All right, now the Chair was going to ask to go through these lights, to give you an opportunity to speak. Senator Lamb, I guess not, he wants to speak on the main amendment? Senator Carsten. Senator Labeledz, do you wish to speak on this Chambers amendment? Senator Hoagland, do you wish to speak on this amendment? Senator Beutler, do you wish to speak on the amendment? Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, I guess I have no objection to the amendment. There is only one of them in the whole package that I'd have some concern about and Senator Warner is the best expert on that. That is government operations, it is a \$35 million ticket item. We would be making the two percent apply to that, so what, it's another \$600,000. Doesn't bother me if you are going to cut. But then I don't understand, I'll be honest with you I don't understand just how serious the government operations thing is, and certainly Senator Warner does. The other things, the other things I can legitimately say, the items he identified maybe I shouldn't have put in there in the first place. Maybe I shouldn't have exempted the Governor's Emergency Fund and the protection of people and property, criminal investigations. I guess I happen to agree with everything he's got with the admonition that I don't understand government operations, just what all impact that would have.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner, did I see your light on? Do you wish to speak on this? Very well. Anyone that wishes to speak on the...Senator Rogers.

SENATOR ROGERS: Mr. President, I would like to know 64-195, protection of people and property, \$8.5 million, what is that?

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp, do you wish to answer?

SENATOR ROGERS: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR DECAMP: I have no idea.

SENATOR ROGERS: Okay, he said State Patrol.

SENATOR DECAMP: State Patrol, I am told.
