

PRESIDENT: The Chair will have to ask all of these different lights if they wish to speak on this main amendment, the DeCamp amendment as amended. Senator Labeledz, Senator Labeledz, do you wish to speak? Senator Hoagland. Senator Rogers. Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers, I'm sure that you wish to speak. Back to the main amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I'm truly enjoying what I am hearing now. In the nonpartisan Legislature partisanship is right here among us. This is anti-Governor talk on the part of these others, but not me. Look around at some of these faces, how tight their jaws are. Just look around, especially at the "repelicans". Just take a minute and look around and see what is really happening on the floor of this Legislature. Some are trembling as though they are going to have apoplexy or have it already. Just look around. Now, Senator Lamb said we've got to take these things one at a time. I tried, on this amendment, to put us in a position where if these types of exclusions are to occur, they will happen one at a time. And Senator Lamb voted against that. I want to find out who is giving the republicans their marching orders around here because sometimes they do behave like traditional conservatives, Senator Lamb, then other times they don't. I know who is giving the demagogues their marching orders. People are running around here upset because I offered amendments, because I take time to discuss the issues that are related to the welfare of the public as I perceive it, and they get upset. Then they pop up like jack-in-the-boxes, giving political partisan speeches, and nobody is supposed to be disturbed. Personally, I am not disturbed. I am enjoying it. The only time we get genuinely on the mark comments about how people feel about each other is when partisanship gets involved and people get a little angry. And nothing makes a "repelican" angrier than to see a democratic governor about to get a victory. Just like when there was a "repelican" governor over there, nothing made the demagogues angrier than when that "repelican" was about to get a victory. But the things have shifted a little bit now. I wasn't involved with the demagogues trying to beat the "repelican", and I'm not involved now with the "repelicans" trying to beat the demagogues, and I can mock all of them, both sides, and there is nothing they can do about it. You are so evenly divided. You are having this fight now, not me. I'm like the announcer at a football game between Nebraska and Oklahoma. I don't even have to tell
