SPEAKER NICHOL: One minute.

SENATOR DECAMP: I urge you to return it.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is, shall the bill be returned for an amendment? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Three are excused. Have you all voted? We are on Final Reading. We should all be here. Record, Mr. Clerk. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Well, could we at least have them check in and have a roll call I guess.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Please record your presence. Please turn your speaking lights off so we can...thank you. Please record your presence and please turn your speaking lights off. Thank you. Senator Hannibal, Senator Hefner, Senator Lynch, Senator Marsh, Senator Remmers. We are looking for Senator Lynch. He has strayed away from the fold. Did you ask for a roll call vote, Senator DeCamp, or what did you say? Yes. We are having a roll call vote on the question as to whether the bill shall be returned for a specific amendment. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote as found on pages 2426-27 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is returned. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: (Response inaudible.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: He moves for the adoption of the amendment. Senator Higgins, please.
