SPEAKER NICHOL: Time is up.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I am going to participate.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hefner, then Senator DeCamp, then Senator Beutler.

SENATOR HEFNER: Call the question.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I would ask you to exercise your power to not accept the motion on the basis that there has not been a fair and full debate since there has been no debate at all except for Senator Chambers.

SPEAKER NICHOL: I would say that is true so I will not call the question at this time. Only one side has been heard. Senator DeCamp is next, then Senator Beutler.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, just to say that Senator Chambers obviously feels very strongly about this bill and as a member of this Legislature he or Senator Beutler or John DeCamp have the right to make any motions and do anything they want. That is the system. It is a little different than most other states, but we don't have a cloture system so that gives any individual on I suppose any issue an inordinate amount of power. And I am not saying that is bad. I am saying that it is not an unusual or new situation. Now Senator Landis probably is the classic
