SENATOR BARRETT: Thank you. I would remind you that we are on Final Reading. We are supposed to be in our seats. Let's do so and check in, please. Please check in. Please check in. Hit your green button. Senator Goodrich, Senator Chizek, Senator Rod Johnson, Senator Lamb, Senator Lynch, Senator Morehead, please hit your buttons. Two are excused. Senator Goodrich, Senator Lamb. We are missing Senators Goodrich and Lamb. Senator Chambers, is it all right to go ahead?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: (Microphone not on)...vote.

SENATOR BARRETT: Machine vote on Senator Chambers' motion to return the bill to committee. All in favor signify by voting aye, opposed no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 28 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return to committee.
