SENATOR BARRETT: Thank you, Senator DeCamp. There are no other lights on so the Chair recognizes Senator Chambers for closing.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, since Senator DeCamp said he also will support the motion to strike the amendment, there is no need to take a lot of time and I hope you will return the bill and that is what we will proceed to do.

SENATOR BARRETT: Thank you. The motion before the house is to return the bill. All in favor signify by voting aye, those opposed no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 7 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

SENATOR BARRETT: Motion to return the bill passes. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I now make a motion to strike the DeCamp amendment. And I have to take this opportunity to make a point. Sometimes trying to legislate in the way that we do can be difficult and it is necessary to use certain tactics to give issues that we all need to have before us the opportunity to develop. So despite the time that was taken this morning, it may ultimately save us a lot more time in the future. I hope you will adopt this motion.

SENATOR BARRETT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, I also hope you adopt the motion. I hope you strike the amendment. I hope you leave the issue up in the air. And I hope you start repudiating ever trying to cooperate in any way, shape or form with these silly task forces where they get a direction, they work hard, they plan things and then they get cold feet and duck out. Senator Hoagland just came up to me and said this is the first time in seven years he has seen me mad on the floor. He's right, I'm mad. I'm mad because of the foolish stupidity of working your tail off to get something done
