I think a couple of times I have achieved that and I want my little piece of flesh. But at any rate I am not going to extend this debate. I hope that you will adopt the amendment.

SENATOR BARRETT: That constitutes the closing. The motion is to strike the DeCamp amendment. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment.

SENATOR BARRETT: We need to readvance the bill.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes...

SENATOR BARRETT: All in favor of readvancing signify by saying aye. Those opposed no. Motion carried, readvanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, I do have another motion to return the bill. However, I do have filed prior to consideration of that a motion to suspend the rules and read the bill without further debate or amendment. That is by Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR BARRETT: Senator DeCamp.
