SENATOR BARRETT: Thank you, Senator DeCamp. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. I would ask that you not take it up and vote without further amendments. There is one amendment that deals with the State Fairgrounds that Senator Warner and I in good faith had put up there and then took out after the DeCamp amendment was successful. The one and only race track that goes up in taxes under this bill is the State Fairgrounds. Everybody else has a reduction in taxes. The amendment from Senator Warner and I would only hold harmless and pay the same taxes this year as they have been paying in the past. We don't even want a tax break as the other race tracks want. I think in fairness to that one error made in the bill, we ought to at least correct that before we go on with the legislation and I would object to taking the bill up without at least considering that amendment. I ask your support for that.

SENATOR BARRETT: Senator Warner, please.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I would rise to support the attempt to make the one amendment also. The bill was portrayed as a hold harmless to the state. The facts are if you look at the fiscal note that Ak-Sar-Ben is reduced \$300,000, Fonner is reduced \$300,000, Columbus reduced \$100,000, Atokad reduced \$40,000 and the Fair operation increased almost \$85,000. Our amendment would hold harmless, leave Lincoln Fair track at approximately the same level that it is now. It seems reasonable and I would hope you would adopt that amendment.

SENATOR BARRETT: Senator Labeledz. Senator Labeledz, please. No other speakers. Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. Chairman...or Mr. President and members of the body, 32 senators just voted a few minutes ago to give the Governor the bill in its original form and being that 32 senators have done this and I was one of them, I do not support returning the bill and I think we ought to let the Governor have the bill as he wants it in its original form. Thank you, Mr. President.
