To argue that we are not going to lose any money is on the assumption that Sunday track...or Sunday racing in Omaha is going to generate so much money that the receipts will be the same to the state. I don't know if that is holding up or not. I recall hearing on the...some report on the first day of Sunday racing which they said was below expectations. I don't know what that meant. But there is no assurance. There is no assurance that there is going to be an equal amount of revenue. What is assured is that you are going to have reduced receipts and it is speculative whether or not you may have...hold even. And it is probably certain that you are not going to have increase, and that is the issue. I would suggest that the bill should be indefinitely postponed. It obviously was not thought through very well. Lots of things were said. I think there is no need for it. The state needs the revenue. I hope you would indefinitely postpone the bill.
