SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, I move to recess until one-thirty this afternoon.

SENATOR BARRETT: Before proceeding to a vote, may we ask the Clerk to read in anything he may want to read in.

SENATOR HABERMAN: That would be fine.

SENATOR BARRETT: Thank you.

CLERK: Mr. President, new A bill, 284A, by Senator Rod Johnson. (Read by title for the first time as found on pages 2435-36 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, there will be a meeting of the Appropriations Committee in Room 1003 at one o'clock today pursuant to a request of 22 senators. And I understand Senator Warner needs to make a comment to that effect.

SENATOR BARRETT: Senator Warner, have you a comment on that announcement?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes. Mr. President, Senator Beutler delivered a letter to me which 22 of you have signed. A request that the Appropriations Committee meet immediately to recommend 10 million in cuts. And the notice is that the committee will meet at one o'clock and I wanted to issue a personal invitation to each of the 22 who signed the letter to come in and make your suggestions that you would like to see the committee consider, if you have any, otherwise we will go ahead and make a consideration of your letter and report whatever decision a majority of the committee believes to be correct. So, thank you.

SENATOR BARRETT: Anything else, Mr. Clerk? Motion to recess until one-thirty offered by Senator Haberman. Not debatable. All in favor signify by saying aye. Those opposed no. The ayes have it. We are recessed.
