

raise the money themselves. They raised three times more than they needed. They would like to have in concrete I guess in the form of ongoing responsibilities, ongoing committed funds, 300,000 this year for community mental health and for alcoholism and drugs. There were some federal funds available. They hadn't been used for two or three years. Why they weren't used, I am not quite sure. There isn't as many federal funds there as we thought there were. We are not quite sure how they can be used. Because there isn't a million dollars there, I am not quite sure how anybody at the state level, the Department of Institutions or otherwise, can guarantee that you are going to get a million dollars. I don't think there is a million dollars there. I would rather forget about the million dollars, simply put, and go with the bill as it reads for the 300,000 apiece for those two programs.

SENATOR NELSON: I appreciate that, Senator Lynch. I think it was to be 500,000 this year and 500,000 next year.

SENATOR LYNCH: Was that it?

SENATOR NELSON: And I might also state for the record and the body, in going through some of the appropriations and so on I think on the federal grant it was again renewed in 1984 for three years additional funding, so it just looks to me like that maybe in 1987 we are really going to be looking down the road for funds for these purposes and I guarantee it will be in working then.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Warner, did you wish to speak on this matter?

SENATOR WARNER: Well, Mr. President, I guess it is mostly for clarification. Do I understand correctly that this is a \$600,000 increase over and above the current number, Senator Lynch?

SENATOR LYNCH: The 600,000 is additional money?

SENATOR WARNER: Right.

SENATOR LYNCH: Yes, it is.

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, okay. And the million dollars is a part of this too?
