

SENATOR LYNCH: Yes, sir.

SENATOR HALL: This year? Add that to the budget.

SENATOR HALL: So in other words, that money that's been there hasn't been allocated. We don't know that it is going to be and what we are dealing here with is monies that we are sure of that will go to those programs that have...will raise in the next four years approximately \$13 million?

SENATOR LYNCH: Yes.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Yes, ma'am.

SENATOR SMITH: May I ask a couple of questions?

SENATOR LYNCH: Yes, ma'am.

SENATOR SMITH: Okay, now this money is new money?

SENATOR LYNCH: I guess as a rose is a rose, is a rose, not necessarily.
