

each of those rules into each of the subdivisions and I think there are six or seven in each rule. And they all are divisible because they all deal with different items. And his motion is debatable. Mr. Chairman.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: In deference to what Senator Hannibal is trying to do, I will withdraw my request to divide the question and he wants to take a vote on suspending the rules so that there can be no further discussion or debate. But what I want to find out is, does that cut off my right to close?

SPEAKER NICHOL: I don't think so. If Senator Hannibal's motion is successful, you still have the right to close. Does that help any?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. Yes.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator DeCamp, point of order.

SENATOR DECAMP: So I understand, this is a motion by Senator Hannibal to suspend the rules and vote on Senator Chambers' amendment. Is that what it is?

SPEAKER NICHOL: That's right.

SENATOR DECAMP: My question is, if this motion can come up at this time, could the motion be made to suspend the rules and just vote on the bill, or would that be out of order?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes, that is out of order.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay, that is all I wanted to know. Just so...very good, very good.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right. Now where we are now is we are on Senator Hannibal's motion and I have three lights. And Senator Hannibal has spoken. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, Mr. Speaker, please clarify for me, I am sorry, I haven't been paying enough attention I guess, is this a motion solely on the Chambers amendments or this a motion on all amendments to 722?
