SPEAKER NICHOL: Well, with this kind of cooperation, I can see we are going to get there quickly. The motion reads, "I move to suspend the rules, Rule 6, Section 5, Rule 7, Section 3, and vote without further debate on amendments...the amendment to 722."

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, in a way that is like stopping further amendment to 722 and in effect he is putting a motion to suspend the rules on 722, and it ought to come at the bottom of those other amendments that are already up there.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER NICHOL: I understand that your amendment came in after this was filed. Okay. Okay. And it was applying to all amendments but this came in ahead of yours but he didn't force the issue to be ahead of yours. He wanted you to speak, I guess. I am assuming that. I don't know if that is true or not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Does it mention my amendment?

SPEAKER NICHOL: No, sir.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then I don't think it applies to mine.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Why not?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I can't just say I want to amend this bill and people figure out what it applies to. Senator Nichol, let me ask you this question, because this is an unusual thing being done. If...let's say that that amendment that Senator Hannibal offered to the motion is found to be in order, and it will be in order if you say so, and it is upheld and a vote is taken on my amendment, am I denied the right to move to reconsider the vote on my amendment? Does his...are you construing what he offered, to cut off everything?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Well, I would think so.
