Well when you cut Wayne State, Chadron State, University of Omaha, what have you, you're cutting people. It's the same difference. You're cutting people. Sure you are. It just isn't as emotional. Senator Labeledz likes to make these things emotional and come back to your heart, say, oh, we can't do these sort of things. I'll bet you that every one of these exclusions will survive with a two percent cut. I'm sure they will because they didn't always have as much money as they have now and they're getting along fine. We've increased and increased and increased, so I'm glad that Senator Lamb has finally seen the light, that he is reborn and that he is supporting this and I ask you all to support Senator Lamb's amendment. Thank you.
