PRESIDENT: Okay, go ahead, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I want to challenge the ruling of the Chair. Any motion made, I believe, is amendable, any motion. When we get in a bind like this toward the end and we let one person play fast and loose with the rules, see they did something to me last night or tried to do it last night on me, then they stopped doing it when we started activity today because others were involved.
