

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: \$600,000.

SENATOR RUPP: \$600,000. Coincidental, that would just fund the A bill on the bill we previously advanced. What exactly are the items that are taxed?

SENATOR DECAMP: I don't remember, but it's okay. It taxes...it taxes, yeah, it's in the handout. I'll get it here.

SENATOR RUPP: Well, moving along, I see in the bill there is a review in evaluation process. Could you explain anything about exactly what that is? Are there sample stretches of road ditch in Antelope County where they count the bottles they pick up every year and see if in fact there is less this year than there was last, or do you know anything about that?

SENATOR DECAMP: Yeah, that's right. That's what it is I think. I don't think we do it in Antelope County though. I think the tests were run elsewhere.

SENATOR RUPP: Do you know anything about these grants that are given out of this \$600,000 a year, who gets them and what they have to do to get them?

SENATOR DECAMP: Communities, communities that clean up, use for clean up, right. They go to those communities and they go to those different groups that do that, yes-siree. Boy scouts maybe sometimes, churches.

SENATOR RUPP: That sounds good. What...any idea how many employees rely on this \$600,000 in this mini bureaucracy that handles the funds? Maybe it isn't a mini bureaucracy for \$600,000, it might even be a maxi.

SENATOR DECAMP: I tell you what, maybe when I give my opening statement on the bill maybe that will explain everything. By then I'll....

SENATOR RUPP: You're excused, Senator DeCamp. Let's call on Senator Rod Johnson, the Chairman of the Ag and Environment Committee. I want to see what case was made in
