Every promise that was made on behalf of the program has been delivered either 100, 200 or in terms of the revenue as much as 400 percent more than was promised. So I dare you, go ahead kill it. The Governor needs this program. The state needs the program. If you think you're going to pass a bottle bill, kill this one and shove your bottle bill up there. The bill is a good program. It has been reviewed. It has been renewed. You said you don't have enough information on it. Passed out about an 18 page booklet that explains its entire history from A to Z. If between now and Select File should it happen to advance, you choose to read it, I think most of your questions will be answered. If you still decide you want to kill it, I think you should. I can offer you several ways if you just want to stop it, you don't think you have the votes to kill it, I can give you different methods to make sure it doesn't pass, to stop it for this session, from amendments and other things and I'll help you prepare those. As I say, I think the program has proved its worth and I think you're nit picking and I think you're not looking at it objectively and I dare you to kill it.
