Do you have any other amendments to the committee amendments?

CLERK: No, sir, nothing further to the committee amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: We are back to the committee amendments. Senator Chambers, did you wish to speak on the committee amendments?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Hoagland a question and he can answer from Senator Schmit's microphone if it is all right. Oh, he is coming back. Senator Hoagland, the question I would like to ask preliminarily refers to the part of the committee amendment that requires the Supreme Court Administrator to develop and implement a statewide automated record-keeping system for all clerks of the district court. Who will pay for that system and how much will it cost?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: It will be 70 percent, 70 percent funded by the federal government, 30 percent funded by the state government.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But that doesn't tell me how much it will cost.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: We introduced an A bill yesterday, Senator Chambers, for the next fiscal year. I think the states...I have got it in my drawer over here. I think it is about \$200,000 in state funds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And that is for the entire bill, all aspects of it?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: That's right. But let me check that figure. I have got it here. This A bill appropriates for the period July 1, '86 to June 30 of '87, \$220,000 from the general fund and \$650,000 from federal funds to carry out those provisions of the act.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But what I am asking is, will that...does that include the amount that would be necessary for the 19 attorneys that the Attorney General's Office will have to hire?
