

it this year is that they made the effective date September something 1986. That is not this year. We have another legislative session that starts in January. So if there has to be so much study, this bill can be bracketed and they can undertake their study this summer and then tell us what we are going to be dealing with next year. I am going to be frank with you. I don't like the bill. I opposed it in committee. I didn't come to the Executive Sessions where they were considering it for advancement because I knew they would advance it. It would be a waste of my time to sit there and argue in the committee when they are going to do what they do anyway. So I am going to do all I can to oppose the bill. And if an honest answer is given and I am going to ask the question, Senator Hoagland, if this bill must be passed this session, why is the effective date being pushed up to September 1st, 1986?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, thank you. Senator Higgins, did you wish to speak on this?

SENATOR HIGGINS: Thank you, Mr. President. I have been visiting with Senator Schmit trying to find out what his problem is with LB 600 and he says he feels about LB 600 about the way I feel about child pornography. I haven't been able to follow Senator Hoagland and Senator Chambers' debate, but I know this, child support is something that is desperately needed throughout the state, not Douglas County, not Lancaster, not Hall, but all over. Now I don't know what Senator Chambers' problem is, but I just told Senator Schmit, if he has got a problem with the Clerk of the District Court in Douglas County, I will find out what it is. Schmit and I went up there two years ago and had a meeting with all the district court judges and the Clerk of the District Court and we laid the law on the line. Shape up or we will see to it that things will get a little more difficult for you. And I think Douglas County has increased its collections of child support. What I am asking Senator Chambers to do and Senator Schmit to do is don't throw the baby out with the bath water. Advance this bill to Select File and if it isn't properly drafted, and if somebody isn't doing their job that is supposed to be doing it, then by golly we will figure a way to take it away from them. And I am sure that before I get back to Omaha, the Clerk of the District Court will have that message. But let's not throw away the money that we need from the federal government to continue a program to keep primarily women off of ADC
