

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And this bill will put it in every county in the state?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: This bill will...let me read the language to you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Just tell me, I'll take your word for it.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Well, I want to be sure I'm correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, then while you're getting to that, does the federal government mandate the creation of a master system? Is that mandated by the federal government, or is that what was decided as a way?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Here is what the federal government says, the federal government says that judges cannot get involved until appeal. I've got the section right here.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, I don't need that, I take your word for it.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I've got the regulations here.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Does the law require...okay, the judges can't get in until appeal.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Until appeal.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Does the law require the creation of this master system? Yes or no. You are trying to...

SENATOR HOAGLAND: In effect the law gives us three options, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But it doesn't mandate this system, does it.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Let me tell you what the three options are that we have.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, just answer the question. You are trying to take all of my time. Okay, if you are not in a hurry, neither am I. Go ahead.
