

For that reason, the accountants who work in the area are vitally interested in this kind of clarification to be put into the bill. I would move for its adoption.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on the Vard Johnson amendment as explained by Senator Landis? If not, the motion is to adopt the Vard Johnson amendment to LB 717. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Twenty-five votes required. Please record your vote. Motion is to adopt the Vard Johnson amendment to LB 717. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Vard Johnson's amendment to the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator DeCamp. This is your amendment, Senator, on page 1896 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator's amendment is on page 1896. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, I'm going to withdraw that amendment. I am waiting for another amendment that is being delivered. I did not anticipate the bill would be up quite this quick. I told them to have it here by ten o'clock, and indeed it is a little before ten o'clock. I'm trusting that somewhere in the vast reaches of space they are listening and they are getting the impression that ten o'clock is going to be a little late and that it would be helpful to have that amendment kind of now. So I'm going to withdraw that amendment. As I say, I have another amendment coming that is a complete bill in itself.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is withdrawn. What is next, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, I'm back to Senator Goodrich who is still excused. I then have a motion from Senator DeCamp to refer it to committee.

SENATOR DECAMP: Yes, Mr. President. Vard asked if this was a stall motion, and indeed that is what it is. It is a motion designed to buy time. Buying time is a concept we've
