

start a domino effect and that is his only reason for being against it. But any reason that justifies a person on casting a bad vote is a bad reason. They selected this particular program because a lot of money was involved and they could say, these are the kind of cuts that we are going to make to reduce the budget so there won't have to be a tax increase, so they pick the most misfortunate or unfortunate people, programs that they can say, if you don't cut them, will cause a substantial amount of money to be spent. I would like to ask Senator Beutler a question, if he is here. Can anybody tell me what NCCY stands for? Because that is a program that under this agency...oh, Senator Marsh is going to help me. And it is already exempted under Senator Beutler's amendment.

SENATOR MARSH: Nebraska Children and Youth Program which is a home and services away from home here housed in Lincoln, Nebraska, near Wesleyan Campus on its own separate campus.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So this is a Lincoln program that was exempted by Lincoln, Senator Beutler, under his amendment as adopted. That is a statement that I am making. You will start the domino effect if you help hungry children, but you don't start it if you help keep a Lincoln program in operation and you have already adopted that. You have adopted, with the Beutler amendment, an exemption that allows this NCCY Lincoln program to continue to be funded. And who is running a game on whom? Senator Beutler isn't running a game on anybody. It is out here in plain sight. I saw it. But I wanted a Lincoln Senator to point out for the rest of you what it is we have dealt with. The crippled children. Senator Nelson says, shoot them down too. These little children who hobble or hop or crawl or however they move are probably making more money than the social worker too, the kind of social workers she talked about, and you are cutting them. So hate the children who are dependent and who are hungry, cut them. But she says cut the crippled children along with them. Senator Warner says that by making across the board cuts in programs such as this, you see the bad policy of making across the board cuts but despite his recognition, and I would have to say it is on moral grounds, that this kind of program ought not be cut in that fashion, he is going to put all that aside and vote against the amendment that would do the decent thing, that would do the right thing, that would do the moral thing. And what did my good friend, Senator DeCamp, say? He hadn't
