

PRESIDENT: Very well. Call of the house has been requested. The question is, shall the house come under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The house is under call. Now, members, please record your presence. Look up to the green light structure in front of the Chamber and see that your light is on. All members of the Legislature outside the Chamber, the house is under call. Please return to the Legislative Chamber and indicate your presence. Senator Warner, Hannibal, Morehead, Scofield, Abboud, Sieck, Senator Vickers, Pappas. Senator Warner, Senator Beutler, Pirsch, Carsten. Roll call vote has been requested in reverse order. Senator Carsten, Senator Pirsch, Senator Vickers, Senator Abboud. Senator Chambers. Senator Pirsch, Senator Abboud is checking in. Senator Vickers. Senator Pirsch, the house is under call, please return to the Chamber. All members who are not excused and are now in the Chamber...Senator Pirsch is coming to her seat. CLERK: (Read the roll call vote as found on page 2507 of the Legislative Journal.) 21 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President.
