

requests following sessions because usually there are deferrals. If you are going to really be able to address future impact you do it by, as painful as it is, elimination of some programs. Finally, may I say those individual things within the committee's recommendations are still subject to 25 members taking back out. I would hope that you would, in doing that, give some thought to doing what we do in the committee when we get to this point during the normal budget year, and that we choose between taking something out to put something else in and still maintain the maximum dollar amount of the appropriation. That might be an approach that some of you may want to look at. I would urge that you adopt this and then get on to those specific ones where other amendments wish to be offered.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the Appropriation Committee's amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. It takes 25 votes. Record, Mr. Clerk, please. Record vote has been asked for.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 2522 of the Legislative Journal.) 32 ayes, 15 nays on the motion to adopt that amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Anything to read in, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Warner has amendments to 722, and Senator Schmit to 653. (See pages 2522-23 of the Legislative Journal.)
