SENATOR LAMB: The motion is the adoption of the Labeledz amendment. For what purpose do you rise, Senator?

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Point of clarification before the vote, Mr. Chair.

SENATOR LAMB: State your point.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: As I understand the amendment, it is going further than the amendment that was offered by the committee. Would you...could you read the amendment?

SENATOR LAMB: Clerk, read the amendment, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Labeledz would move to amend the Beutler-Vickers amendment as follows: (Read the Labeledz amendment as found on page 2536 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR HANNIBAL: That was what took us what we call the compromise situation? Would that be a legitimate? What was called the compromise last week.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: What you did in LB 31 as it stands now, you took out the unborn child and then the Appropriations Committee, as I understand it, went further and took out the pregnant woman. So what I am trying to do here is put back the pregnant woman and the unborn child.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: So it is the amendment of last...a few days ago that we had and the amendment today combined and put them both back in?

SENATOR LABEDZ: That's right. We are putting back the whole program, the unborn child and the pregnant woman.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Thank you.
