SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, the question is, shall the house go under call? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Please record your presence. Those not here, please return to the Legislative Chamber so that we can continue with the business. We are voting to cease debate and call in votes has been authorized.
