

CLERK: 28 ayes, 12 nays on adoption of Senator Vickers' amendment to the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion is adopted. What do you have next?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have is by Senator Beutler.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Clerk, I would ask leave to substitute an amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: I object.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, I would move to substitute the amendment notwithstanding the objection.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. Senator Haberman, did you wish to speak about this? Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, Mr. Speaker, I would like to explain what this is all about.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I have my amendment up and after my amendment you should understand that a motion to suspend the rules is in place. So in all likelihood on the Beutler amendment and on the Warner, or Appropriations Committee amendment, which is the Beutler amendment now, this is probably the last discussion that we will have on it.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Beutler, may I interrupt? (Gavel.) I would like to have you listen to this. I think it is important so that you will have the background as to what we are doing. Senator Beutler, excuse me for interrupting.
