I think the priority thing required in the rules is that we get that bill there. The only way to do it is something like this, so I would ask that this motion be taken up and we vote on it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers was first for a...I assume Senator Chambers wanted to make a point of order. Did you?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I wanted to ask the question of how his motion, first of all, he doesn't even have a motion up there to do what he is talking about. He is trying to substitute that for something else he had up there, so I'd like to get clear step by step just how he got to where he is now with this motion.

SENATOR DECAMP: I'm claiming...I'm making the claim, outrageous as it is, that the system is deadlocked, that the rules by 30 votes require...I mean, the rules require that we have the bill over there, that we're not getting it done, therefore, this is the only mode to effect things, therefore, it has a priority. It will probably be ruled out of order at which point I will then say, I move to overrule the Chair.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then what you are saying...

SENATOR DECAMP: I just want to get the bill to the Governor's Office and break this and get on with this.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But I don't understand, Senator DeCamp, what you're saying because it might come up again before the session is over. You're saying that we have to get a budget bill to the Governor.

SENATOR DECAMP: That's what the rules say.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And what does the rule say about that?

SENATOR DECAMP: It gives us a deadline and we've violated that already and this is the closest thing I can come up with to try and comply with the deadlines and the rules of the Legislature.
