When you decide and usually what's happened for those of you who haven't been here before when you start doing this over and over, you lose what you had before. I supported some of the agencies this morning that went out the window. I'll tell you I'm getting to the place where I'm not going to support anything of that nature when we continue simply to elongate the program and if it's your idea to simply stand here and argue and bring up things simply to make the rest of us miserable, which you have done at times but mostly we don't admit it, but you look silly, I'll tell you on television when we continue this way. I hope we get down to work and do things.

PRESIDENT: The Chair is ready to make a ruling. The motion of Senator DeCamp contending that it is a priority motion because of Rule 8, Section 4, the Chair determines that the rule, that the motion is not in order and the ruling may be challenged and appealed. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Yes, I'm going to challenge it. I know of no other way to break the deadlock and get on with our business. If anybody has a better suggestion, I'm willing to listen. We sent the Appropriations Committee out. I thought we made pretty clear commitments here. I think they've been breached. I think at this point it is time to say there probably aren't the votes to do any particular thing. There may be the votes, but those who are in opposition have made it very clear, I think Senator Chambers made it clear, didn't you, that you intend to have reconsiderations and every other priority motion that you can conceive so that nothing will happen. Now if somebody has a better idea, I'll sure listen, but at this point it's time to face facts that this place is deadlocked. I'm
