PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, maybe we can work something out here. We got most of us back there, I think maybe we worked out something or got it...before I make my next move I've got to know this. Senator Warner...oh, oh, they're hollering at each other now. Oh, they're going to slug each other now, so...Mr. President, I thought we had something maybe possibly worked out but it may be deteriorating. See, let me tell you what I was kind of thinking of here. I was kind of thinking of letting one shot on one amendment involving the three advocacy agencies go before and it goes up or down and then no matter what happens, up or down, we quit battling and adopt the amendment and advance the bill. However, there isn't complete agreement at this point. Why don't we recess for five minutes? I'd move to recess for five minutes. Stand at ease, call the doctor or whatever.

PRESIDENT: That's...very well, the Chair would declare that the Legislature will stand at ease for ten minutes.
