

PRESIDENT: Three and a half minutes left, Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DEKAMP: Yeah, I'll be brief. All I'm trying to do is bring to a head the vote on the Appropriations Committee package. Now, if I were picking and choosing and doing it my own way, I would have gone back to my one and four which I still thought was the best idea out here. Unfortunately nobody has offered it or it hasn't been taken up so at this point I guess there is nothing to do other than, I'm asking you or suggesting you suspend the rules and then vote on this amendment. If you decide to do something later, maybe we can talk about it, but at this point I guess we're going to decide whether you want to put the Appropriations Committee package into 722. Remember all these amendments, all this discussion and everything up till now has never been put into the bill itself so this is the vote, first of all, to suspend the rules should you choose to do it and, second of all, then whether you're going to put that package in and with that said, use your own judgment.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to suspend the rules and proceed to an immediate vote on the Beutler amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Thirty votes required. We're voting on the suspension of the rules to proceed to an immediate vote on the Beutler amendment. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Record... a record vote has been requested. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 2551-52 of the Legislative Journal.) 36 ayes, 11 nays on the motion to suspend rules, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The rules are suspended to allow the vote to take place in the next motion. Now proceed to the vote on the Beutler amendment as amended. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Please record your vote on the Beutler amendment as amended. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk. A record vote has been requested.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 2552-53 of the Legislative Journal.) 35 ayes, 12 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion is carried. Do you have matters for the record, Mr. Clerk?
