SENATOR CONWAY: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, what I have before you is an amendment that I've got some handouts to be passed out. What we're requesting under this amendment is dealing with the mental retardation regions and a redistribution as many of you may be aware as we have dealt with some of the problems that have come down through this area. There has been some specific needs from a couple of the regions that somewhat reflect the redistribution of some of the funds. Now contrary to most of the activity that we've been dealing with the last two weeks which is trying to garner funds for a particular program, this is not intended to garner any new funds. It's simply a shift between regions of the existing base of monies that they have in the region. Particular attention in this amendment is given towards Region 4.
