

SENATOR LYNCH: Absolutely.

SPEAKER NICHOL: No, no, I was just asking if you...you said you may withdraw it, and if you did I would give you...

SENATOR LYNCH: I have mixed emotions about it because I'm not sure people really understand, and I know it's late, how important this really is. So...

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right. Senator Sieck, please.

SENATOR SIECK: Mr. President. members of the body, I'm going to support Senator Lynch's motion. I feel that Senator Morehead maybe was correct in some statements here. But we need to look at the level of care of both the community and the institutional. You must remember we have some in the community programs that are one-to-one. We have some of those that take the same type of care that they do in institutional. So I think that is the way they should be paid, about what level of care that they are receiving, and they should be based the same whether it is in the institution or whether it is in the community program. I think that is what Senator Lynch is addressing. That is what he wants done and he wants them to look at both areas. As I understood Senator Warner, they are going to work at this. This little amendment isn't going to hurt anything. It is just going to be assured that this job gets done. I
