SENATOR HOAGLAND: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, we have with us today, under the balcony, Max Smith who is a Regional Representative of the Office of Child Support Enforcement with the Department of Health and Human Services in Kansas City. He has prepared a two-page explanation of LB 600 and why it is essential that we pass this bill this year with an effective date of this year. LB 600, of course, is a very complicated bill pertaining to child support enforcement. As you'll recall we debated it on General File two weeks ago, I believe. Mr. Smith has flown up from Kansas City today to make himself available to explain the bill, to explain the federal policy, and once again some of the consequences of our not acting on this important measure this session. He is going to be here throughout the day and will be in Speaker Nichol's office principally, although he will be here on the floor for a little while, if any of you would like to visit with him about any aspects of LB 600. Also during the day today we'll be passing out a section-by-section summary of some Select File amendments in addition to these materials prepared by Mr. Smith. Thank you.

I strongly urge any members of the Legislature, who have questions or problems with LB 600, to visit with him today in my office. He will be there from now on until noon. I really urge you to do this if you have troubles or problems with this LB 600. Thank you again for being our guest today.
