

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Miller.

SENATOR MILLER: So in essence what the enacting of this amendment to the amendment, and then the amendment does to 723 will not involve any state appropriations, but it will enable the private industry to contribute \$100,000 towards the vet school if, in fact, there would be a vet school enacted. I know we have 204 to talk about yet. But if 204 doesn't pass, then there will be no attempt on 204A. If 204 does or does not pass, this still involves no state appropriations. I would move for the adoption of the amendment to the amendment, then the amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: I have two lights. Senator Warner, did you wish to speak to the Rod Johnson amendment?

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, mostly I need to more clearly understand. Senator Miller, this is \$100,000 of cash fund authorization for this year and next year there is nothing, if I understand you correctly, as far as construction funds of any source beyond that in the amendment?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Were you asking Senator Miller a question? Senator Warner (sic) would you respond, to a question.

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, he answered by shaking his head.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Shaking your head doesn't record very well.

SENATOR MILLER: That is correct.

SENATOR WARNER: He shook it.

SENATOR MILLER: To the best of my knowledge there is no commitment.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I guess the body will have to decide whether they want to do it. I had hoped that anything dealing with the vet college was going to be handled in 204. But which ever side you are on on the issue, I guess, here is one place to decide it.
