In Clay Center, right now, is a federally owned research or experimental facility. Right now presently it is mainly with federal operations and with a large amount of capital outlay. The rumor has been for a long time that the federal government would like to get rid of Clay Center and give it to the State of Nebraska. I feel if we do ever build and build down there, it is going to commit us further to pick up another piece of property, another piece of experimental farm that we really don't need and can't justify in the State of Nebraska. Clay Center, right now, does not even have a pathologist down there working there, whereas North Platte does. North Platte has facilities halfway available already. It is located right across from a community technical school...college. I think it would be a tremendous cost-savings factor if we could adopt this amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Warner, did you wish to speak to the Pappas amendment to the amendment?

SENATOR WARNER: No, I'd rather not.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right. Senator Wesely, did you wish to speak to the...Senator Pappas, did you wish to close on your amendment?

SENATOR PAPPAS: I'd just ask for adoption.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question before you is the adoption of the Pappas amendment to the Miller amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 5 ayes, 7 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The amendment to the Miller amendment fails. Do you have another amendment, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Did you say you have another amendment?

CLERK: Yes, I do.
