And, no, it wasn't you, Senator Warner, but it was some committee members and you know who you are. And there is a matter of record up there. I think Senator Beutler said, the other day, that what goes around comes around. It's beginning to come around now for those committee members who voted against the amendment I had awhile ago. I'm happy that it passed because I think it would have been a big mistake to make those future commitments. Thank you, Mr. President.
