

like a lot of money, but if you were in the business, and I was for about 30 years, plumbing, heating and air conditioning, I can tell you that kind of a monumental building needs a special kind of conditioning system. The cost also includes refurbishing and remodeling the damage that would have to be done in the process of providing the conditioned air system. So I would suggest to the body that we not support the Senator Haberman amendment, and in fact support the proposal by Senator Warner.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Remmers, please.

SENATOR REMMERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I rise to oppose Haberman's amendment, Senator Haberman's amendment. The issue that he referred to, I believe, back in '82 believe it or not Senator Wesely and I were on the same issue. I think Senator Wesely and Senator Rumery and I introduced this bill, were co-signers on this bill for \$20,000 and we didn't get it. At that time I was very concerned and I could not understand why there wasn't any response to the seriousness of the situation. Morrill Hall is something...the exhibits there can't be replaced.

SPEAKER NICHOL: (Gavel.) Gentlemen in the back, would you please hold it down so we can hear the speakers. Thank you, Senator Wiley Remmers.

SENATOR REMMERS: There are many things that we could put off if we need to, but you put this off too long and you're not going to have any exhibits left for Morrill Hall. As I understand those exhibits are deteriorating. I haven't been there recently but I have been through the building several times. I always enjoy the time I spend there and marvel at the exhibits that are there. I doubt that there is any place other than...probably second to the Capitol as far as students that tour Morrill Hall. To allow this...these exhibits to deteriorate I think is unconscionable. Surely we can find the money for planning. I know that the millions Haberman talks about must be a lot of money. I don't know. I've never had that kind of money. But it is a lot of money, but nevertheless I do know that these exhibits are priceless. You can't put a price tag on them because they are irreplaceable. I think it would be a shame if we didn't get started on the renovation of Morrill Hall, do it promptly. I would urge you to vote against Senator Haberman's amendment.
